John shared that Believe 2 Achieve is looking well from the auctions and other items standpoint, but we are only at 250 attendees. If those 250 bid on the items we have had donated should have a

successful event. He also shared that the dates have been set for the Foundation Board of Trustee meetings at Terracon.

# Deborah Schultz – International Service

<u>Butambala District Uganda Project</u> – Nathan has spent the last month getting the funds to complete the three solar powered wells. Delays at Nathan's District, which is contributing \$12,500, slowed down the installation. It is now estimated that the actual construction will begin the end of June with completion 6-8 weeks later. That will finish this project. With solar and installation in five schools, refrigeration for vaccines for the clinic as well as solar installations, and with the three solar pumped wells, an estimated 20,000 people ongoing will be served.

<u>Madagascar Sanitary Village Project</u> - The WAC committee voted unanimously to use the next fiscal year's fundraising efforts. The committee hopes our fundraising will include an event, as in the past two years, to support Hux and Ariel's Madagascar project. Major club support for their project as in the case of Uganda and Ghana seemed both right and fair.

Ghana Project - The Otchere' are continuing to seek ongoing support via a District 6670 grant.

All three of the current projects are ongoing.

World Affairs Council Program - The committee gave \$2,000 in our "local international fund" to the World Affairs Council to sponsor 100 students attending the annual Global Education Summit at NKU last November. Gamble and Clark students were ultimately unable to attend due to the ice storm—bus service was canceled, but the money could not be refunded for lunches and other expenses. The council will be scheduling an in house program which essentially replicates what students missed in the fall in their respective schools and will reach more students. This is a program on "global and local water resources and management" and includes both a corporate presentation from a Northern Kentucky Company as well as materials and a facilitated a workshop.

#### Youth Exchange

Ariel Miller has left this committee only because she wants to do other things in Rotary. Dave and I have spoken to an amenable Peter Baden about continuing to have a role. A new chair will be named.

#### Rotary International

No news re: RI contributions this year. Our club contributions affect the amount of grant money available to our district three years out and we are still a large club.

#### Claudia Cagle - Community Service

Nothing new to report.

#### <u>Brett Lebhar – Youth Service</u>

Brett shared his updates on three of the Youth Service Organization.

<u>RYLA</u> - Three of our sponsored RYLA students visited the Rotary lunch on May 16 and spoke about their experiences.

Interact - The Certificate of Organization was presented to Cincinnati Country Day Interact Club President Alexia Otchere by Brett Lebhar and DG Bill Shula at the Rotary lunch on May 23. Alexia gave a presentation about the Club's activities this year. Four other CCDS Interact students attended as well.

<u>Rotaract</u> - Brett recommend that our Rotary Club suspend any further action to sponsor the re-launch of a community Rotaract Club because our efforts the past three years have borne very little fruit. If we were to make any additional efforts to expand Rotaract, I suggest they be targeted at expanding college Rotaract, perhaps with a new Club at Mt. St. Joe (given they're a Corporate

member of our Rotary Club) or at Cincinnati State. This topic needs Board discussion, with an agreement on the future direction of Rotaract.

# <u>Dave Carlin – President-Elect</u>

Dave Carlin shared his experience at the Rotary International Convention. The things he liked best were the opening session and the daily plenary sessions. They talked a lot about the polio eradication effort. Dave questioned how many of our members know the vaccine was developed here. We're going to plan an event around World Polio Day in October.
